Replying to your favor of January 27th, I beg to advise you that the only woman doing work in our School of Applied Science is Miss Ginette Leclerc, Margaret Morrison Dormitory, Mellon Annex, 5052 Forbes Street, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, a French woman who has been sent here by the French High Commission in order that she may have an opportunity to take special instruction in engineering subjects.

We do not permit women to register in the Engineering School under our present regulations. They are registered in the Margaret Morrison Carnegie School for Women and elect work in this school.

During the past summer we offered special war courses to women and a considerable number, perhaps a hundred, completed courses in Tracing and Drafting. These courses are not now being offered.

If you desire the names of these women I can secure them for you if you will notify me to that effect.
